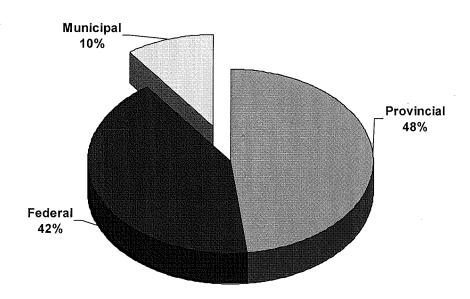

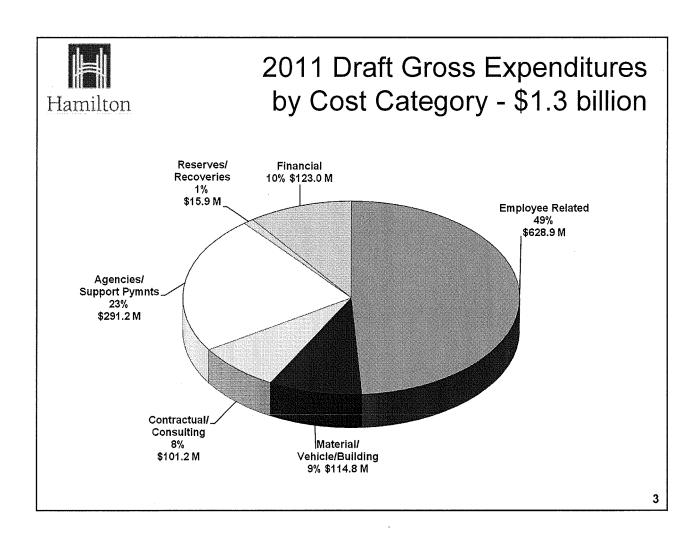

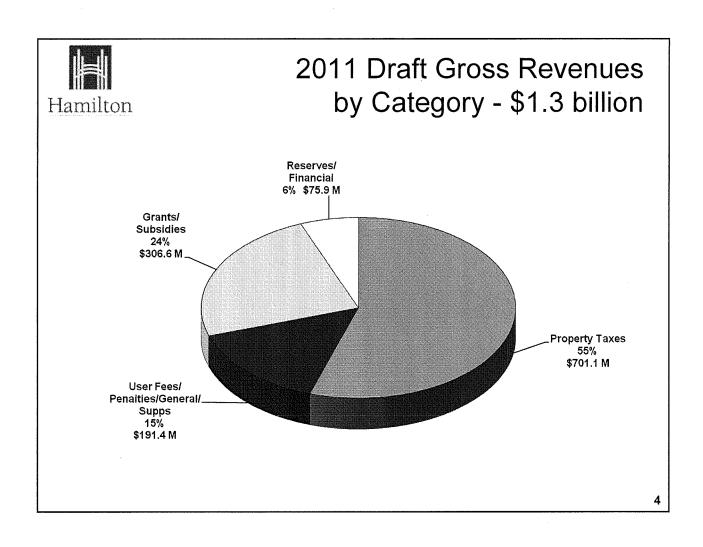


Where do the Average Person's Taxes Go?

Reduction Process

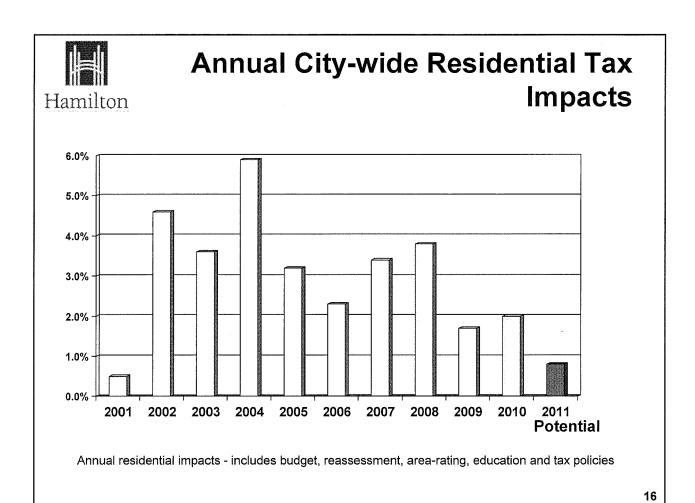


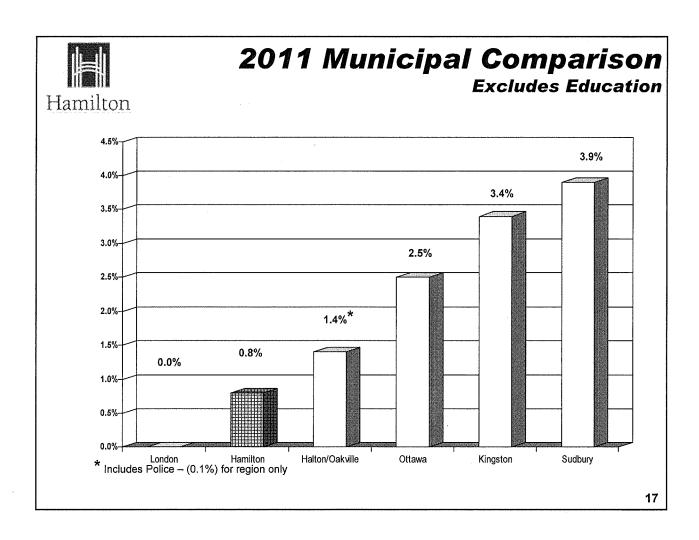
